NOTES ON THE POSTLUDE: Theological subjects inform nearly all of Olivier Messiaen's organ music, which is permeated with mysticism. In *L'Apparition de L'Église Éternelle (Vision of the Eternal Church)* (1932), the Eternal Church comes into and recedes from sight in an inexorable crescendo and diminuendo. The composition uses a harmonic language called "a mode of limited transposition" and is supported by rhythm that is derived from Hindu rhythms. It begins and ends quietly, but reaches a thunderous climax in the center of the work.
