



- MAR. 11: Philadelphia's Mural Arts Restorative Justice Program. Jane Golden discusses "Beyond the Wall," which incorporates the concepts of restorative justice through art instruction, mural making, and community service work.
- MAR. 18 AND 25: Restorative Justice. Dr. Tim Horner, Assistant Professor at Villanova and director of the Center for Peace and Justice, shares his research about the Gacaca Court System that was used after the Rwandan genocide.
