OCTOBER PRELUDES AND POSTLUDES

This month, all of the organ preludes and postludes will be by the north German organist and composer, Dieterich Buxtehude (c. 1637-1707). During the 17th century, organs in the northern part of Germany were more advanced than those in the south. They had a full plenum (full organ) in each division, numerous colorful flute and reed pipes, as well as a fully developed and independent pedal division. All of this encouraged the composition of demanding repertoire featuring virtuoso sections for the hands and feet alike. Becoming familiar with the varying styles of Buxtehude's *oeuvre* in the coming weeks will prepare you for the American premiere of a work Edward Landin commissioned by American organist and composer Pamela Decker. Entitled *Praeludium*, Decker's work is a 21st century "take" on the most popular organ composition of Buxtehude's day. It will be the prelude on October 25.
