

THE PRELUDE AND POSTLUDE

Today's prelude, *Prelude on the Carillon d'Alet*, was written at the request of Edward Landin and composed in November 2015. It was his idea to have me write a companion piece to a work I had previously written, *Fugue on the Carillon d' Alet*, which is based on the two-tone Angelus heard daily from the bell tower of Église-St-André in Alet-les-Bains, France where I spend time each summer. The new piece is in the form of a Scherzo-Fantasy and based on the same Angelus tones. It starts quietly and mysteriously with the theme developed and explored though numerous harmonic progressions. The main theme is heard at various points and builds to a climax with the bell tones heard in both manuals and pedal after which the mystery and quiet sense of wonder returns to conclude the piece. ~ Craig Phillips
