

"Christ's Supper at Tiberius" is one of three bas relief panels located at the base of the reredos at the front of our Chapel. Sculpted by artist Anthony Visco and installed in the chapel in 1989, this triptych of bas reliefs depicts Christ's baptism by John the Baptist, the Sermon on the Mount, and the supper at Tiberius. Mr. Visco, one of the leading sculptors in America, is the founder and director of The Atelier for the Sacred Arts in Philadelphia. Upon graduation from the University of the Arts (formerly Philadelphia College of Art), he was the recipient of the Fullbright–Hayes Grant to travel and study in Italy, where he attended studios at the Accademia delle Belle Arti in Florence.
