

TODAY'S MUSIC

Today's offertory anthem, *Ye Followers of the Lamb*, is a boisterous setting of a Shaker song that was first noted in 1847 in the manuscript hymnal of Clarissa Jacobs, New Lebanon, New York. The Shakers were *millennians* (they believed in Christ's imminent second coming -- as a woman). They practiced confession of sins, communal ownership, celibacy and withdrawal from the world. They were known for praying themselves into a frenzied dance, shaking their bodies wildly to get rid of evil spirits.

Shaker villages resounded with passionate and often beautiful song. Many Shaker songs were written, in fact, as dance tunes. Shaker worship included a strong component of dancing and foot-tapping in songs and revealed the gentle and deeply spiritual nature of their worship and worldview.

Today's postlude, *Paean*, is by beloved British composer, Herbert Howells. *Paean* dates from May 1940. It takes the form of a vigorous toccata in D stemming from two contrasted themes. The first unfolds in a semiquaver stream over the initial tonic pedal, Allegro sempre briso in three-four time. The second is chordal and more rhythmic and supplies the Largamente coda leading to the final major chord.
