"Creation": Today's cover art uses the story cards that depict the seven days of creation from our classroom for four year olds—the Worship Center. The Worship Center uses a unique model of Montessori based story telling that invites our young children to interact deeply with the Biblical Narrative.

TODAY'S ANTHEM

William Mathias (1934-1992) is one of Wales' most renowned composers. A child prodigy, he started playing the piano at the age of three and began composing at the age of five. After studying at the Royal Academy of Music, Mathias was elected as a fellow there in 1965. He was professor of music at the University of Wales, Bangor, from 1970 until 1988. He founded the North Wales International Music Festival in 1972, and continued as its director until his death. He composed symphonies, concertos, an opera and numerous smaller works. His compositions include large scale works, including an opera, The Servants (1980), three symphonies and three piano concertos. Much of his music was written for use in sacred services, most famously the anthem Let the people praise thee, O God written for the July 1981 royal wedding of the Prince and Princess of Wales, which had a television audience of an estimated 1 billion people worldwide. O Sing unto the Lord was commissioned by the BBC and first performed in 1965. It robustly and rhythmically sets portions of Psalms 96 and 98.
