"Daniel"

Prophets are people who listen to God and tell the people all that God said. Sometimes prophets speak and sometimes prophets act. Prophets show the people of God how to be faithful. Daniel was a prophet and a leader. During his life, Daniel showed the people how to be faithful in many different ways. In this passage, Daniel was faithful in his prayers even though that meant he would be sent to the lions. As Daniel was faithful, so too was God faithful. God protected Daniel in the lion's den. Many children worry that there is a place where God is not present. Daniel's story helps to illustrate that we are always free to speak to God. The story shows us that no matter where we are, God is with us.

Our summer sermon series is based upon the Old Testament stories we teach to our youngest children, hoping that children in worship will recognize these stories and the child in each of us will recall the foundational biblical witness for the life of faith.
