

Notes on the Service Music

Today, for World Communion Sunday, we present a variety of spiritual music from around the world. *Bwana Asifiwe* is a traditional Swahili melody that incorporates the hymn *Praise to the Lord the Almighty*. I composed *This is My Song* for the Sanctuary Choir's 1995 tour to Russia and Finland. It sets the familiar tune, *Finlandia*, and stresses the need for peace among all lands. Boniface Mganga, the late director of the Kenyan National Choir, arranged *Kaung'a Yachee* that comes to us from the Bantu tribe of Kenya. Mganga visited in the United States in 2001, guest-conducting the Sanctuary Choir and the Singing City Choir. *Bolo Jay, Mikar Jay* is a popular communion song from India. Finally, we are delighted to welcome two drummers from Philadelphia's Kule Mele African Drum Ensemble to our worship service. We invite you to enjoy their work on the front flagstones following the service.
