PRELUDE

The Ringers on the Green, directed by Matthew Webb, is an ensemble of high school students representing the music ministry of The Presbyterian Church in Morristown, New Jersey. The choir rings six octaves of Schulmerich handbells and five octaves of Schulmerich handchimes. In its 46-year history, the group has performed in 40 states, Canada, Bermuda and Europe. The Ringers on the Green regularly lead in services of worship and perform for numerous New Jersey-based civic and religious organizations throughout the year.

A conductor and organist, Webb is Director of Music at The Presbyterian Church, where he conducts their adult and high school musical ensembles. He holds a bachelor's degree in music and philosophy from Wake Forest University and a master's and doctoral degree in conducting from the University of North Carolina. Dr. Webb has been a parish musician in Episcopal, Baptist, United Methodist and Presbyterian congregations, where he has built choral and instrumental programs for children, youth and adults. He has served on the faculties of Drew University, Elon University, the University of North Carolina School of the Arts and the Canterbury School. He is a member of the American Choral Directors Association, the Presbyterian Association of Musicians, and is Dean of the Metro New Jersey Chapter of the American Guild of Organists.


