



WALKWAY REPLACEMENT PROJECT. The flagstones on the walkway/patio in front of the Sanctuary are to be replaced starting on Wed., July 5. During construction, we ask that you enter the Sanctuary via the four side entrances.

A separate, temporary handicap-accessible walkway connecting to the existing handicap-accessible entrance provides access for people who use walkers or wheelchairs or those unable to walk up the steps to the side entrances. Buses and vans transporting church attendees from senior residences should use the west driveway (Ministries Center side) to provide access to the handicap-accessible walkway, with Helping Hands team members present to assist.
