



HYMNAL DEDICATION LIST. The hymnal dedication list is available to view in binders in the back of the Sanctuary and the Chapel. The list includes names of donors who contributed to the purchase of the *Glory to God* hymnals in 2015 as well as their dedications.

NEW CHANCEL LIGHTING IN SANCTUARY. With a generous financial contribution from anonymous donors, the six-light incandescent fixtures in the balconies and on the edge of the stained-glass windows in the chancel area in the front of the Sanctuary are to be replaced with 24 new energy-efficient LED fixtures. Six of the new fixtures will provide colored light for theatrical productions. The project also includes installation of new lighting controls.

The donors wanted to provide better illumination in front of the church during worship and limited theatrical lighting when the Sanctuary is used for musical and theatrical productions. Work is expected to be finished by Fri., Aug. 11. The project will not affect worship services on Sundays.
