TODAY'S PRELUDE is a multi-verse chorale prelude on the Advent hymn tune "Savior of the Nations, Come." Also called a chorale fantasia, this immense work contains four different settings of the hymn tune. The first verse is the most simplistic, with the chorale melody featured in the pedal while also ornamented in the soprano voice. Verse two has a more florid texture, with echo effects. The third verse is a sarabande, and the second beat of each measure is accented. The final verse is a dialogue between two different plenums of the organ, and as in the first verse, the chorale melody is featured in the pedal line. Nicolaus Bruhns (c. 1665-1697) was the most talented pupil of Dieterich Buxtehude (c. 1637-1707); both were major influences to none other than Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750).


